This week we have made great progress on our talk for writing story and have even turned a little bit into a song which we all thoroughly enjoyed! We have continued searching for and experiencing the signs of autumn, going on scavenger hunts to collect things for the classroom to learn with, discussing how the environment changes and talking about the animals we may find in the habitats closest to us at this time of year. We are making super progress in our phonics learning and are amazed that we are now able to read so many words! 






Message from Mrs Bramwell – Oak Class

In geography we have been learning about our local area. We have used Google Maps to take a virtual tour of Barnby and North Cove looking at the human and physical features. This week we used our knowledge of our local area to add symbols to a map. By creating a key now we can help people who are not so familiar with our local area to find the park or village hall.





Willow Class have been very enthusiastic in their learning this week and have enjoyed the opportunity to write their rags to riches story. We spent the beginning of the week planning and writing our draft which was quite tricky for some to then transform it into a published story. Today we have spent some time editing and improving our stories to make sure they were written to the best of our ability.

During our maths lessons we have had great fun this week practicing our addition. We have learnt about the different approaches to addition and also spent a long time practising with place value counters and drawings. We are nearly ready to move onto our abstract method of column addition where we will then get to try some interesting problems to solve.

The children have spent time reflecting on which learning characteristics they have used in lessons this week. Many children said they had spent time building links. This has been a real key part of our learning, especially when it is time to apply our learning in the final stages of a unit.



Message from Mr Lea – Chestnut Class

This week the children have been expressing their poetic skills in Chestnut class. We have studied the poems of Benjamin Zephaniah - evaluating them by engaging in debates, performing them collaboratively and then attempting to use some of the subjects in the poems by building links to write our own poetry.

In Maths we are now focused on the final of the four operations - Division! We are being purposeful in our work and developing our understanding of written methods and how we write remainders as fractions.

Our study of Earth and Space this week took us to consider Space Travel and the new developments - in particular the Virgin Galactic experience and we all wrote letters, being imaginative and creative, to Mrs Scott to persuade her to allow us to go on a class trip into Space!

Thank you to all the parents who have replied regarding the proposed residential trip - asking questions and clarifying details. I look forward to informing you of the results soon!
