Things to note ...


Could everyone please bring in a plastic used bottle that is less than 500ml for us to create sea creatures with next week. Also any junk modelling small parts would be great.


Thank you to everyone who helped make our garden so beautiful at the weekend. Oak Class absolutely loved learning in such an inspiring setting.


In the slightly cooler classroom we have made teeny tiny Torahs as we learn about the Jewish holy book. We know the Torah is very special and it takes around a year to make as well as read from cover to cover. It has a special place in the synagogue called the ark. We often use our fingers to point to words but the Torah can't be touched so Jews use a little pointer called a yad which means hand in Hebrew. Our Torahs were tricky to make and we worked together so they didn't unroll.


It has been another fabulous – but very hot - week in Willow Class. In literacy this week we have been writing shape poems! Have a look at the wonderful examples below.





We are now going to start looking at explanation texts and learning how to write our own about something the children are fascinated by.

In science we have been curious whilst looking at forces. We have been out on our lovely playground looking at how we can show the forces of push and pull, and we have been running toy cars (kindly lent to us by Acorn Class) across different surfaces to find out about friction.
